### **PASTORAL REFLECTIONS**

Nurturing Our Faith and Discipleship

Yes, "the times they are a changin'." The church is not exempt from this change. Fewer Americans identify themselves as Christians on demographic surveys, and the number of Americans who do not identify with any religion continues to increase. One reason people often give is that the institutional church has no relevancy for their lives. The PC(USA) Mission Agency writes, "As much as this new reality is alarming, it is also an opportunity for our congregations, worshiping communities and mid councils to wake up and seize the moment." In other words, churches are called to increase congregational vitality.

What then is congregational vitality? Is it based on how many members and programs a church has? No. Is it based on financial contributions and having a huge budget? No. Congregational vitality is based on the spiritual strength of the members and the willingness and ability of the members to join in purpose-driven mission.

"Congregational vitality is evident in a worshiping community when its structural systems, finances and discipleship practices are aligned in such a way that the community is actively engaged in the mission of God in their local community and the world, and they are powerfully focused on growing as disciples in the way of Jesus Christ. Faith comes alive when we boldly engage God's mission and share the hope we have in Christ." (PCUSA Mission Agency)

What does this mean? It means in all that a church does everything is aligned, so that the church is "actively engaged in the mission of God in [the] local community and the world." This means the church's primary focus is not inward but outwards, seeking to serve the needs of those in the local community and in the world. It also means that it is not something that just church leaders or the pastor does, but is something that all members are called to do. How can each one of us "engage in the mission of God" locally and globally?

I am also struck by the words "faith comes alive." The focus is not only on mission but on individual faith and discipleship. How can we as a congregation encourage and support each other on our journey to become better disciples? It is also an opportunity for each of us to do our own self-check up on our discipleship. Is my own faith a living faith? Am I willing to allow God to direct my life?

One sign of a vital congregation is: "A commitment to forming disciples over every member's lifetime. This leads first to personal transformation, as people put on the heart of Christ, and then to social transformation, as people joyfully go forth into the community and tackle the issues facing today's culture." (PCUSA Mission Agency).

### **SUMMARY OF SESSION MEETING**

The regular September Stated Session was held in the church library on Wednesday, October 2, 2019. Session members present included: Moderator Rev. Dr. Julie Kling, Jody Amor, Linda Hamilton, Bob Humberger, John Roush, Don Steen, Larry Stout, and Nicole Whetstone. Bill Taylor was medically excused.

Pastor Kling read Matthew 4:17-22 as the opening prayer. She led a discussion of the second of the seven marks of a vital congregation, "Intentional Authentic Evangelism." Pastor Kling followed with several reflection questions concerning evangelism such as "What keeps us from sharing the Good News in our daily lives?" She then concluded with prayer.

The clerk reported the following Sunday Worship Attendance: Sept. 1 – 40; Sept. 8 – 41; Sept. 15 – 41; Sept. 22 – 40; and Sept. 29 – 46.

Pastor Kling gave a verbal report of her activities in September. She did sermon preparation and preaching on Sundays. She consulted with Bill Taylor on the Stewardship Emphasis planning. She attended to the details of the Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas services. She participated in a Pastors' Virtual Conference on future ministry to seniors.

The Treasurers report is summarized as Year to date income - \$102,592, expenditures - \$84,881, and surplus - \$18,495

Leadership Team reports were Administration and Finance – New sidewalk completed in front of the church for \$150 in materials and \$30 gift card to Bill Schling for donated labor. Purchased new carpet sweeper. Boiler was inspected during the week of October 8 by AIR-EEZ. Vida Church wedding Saturday, Oct 5. Job search for organist placed in 6 places. Music, Worship, and Sacraments - Battery driven candles for Advent Wreath are being ordered. Rainbow Station Board -Enrollment is 26 with no openings. Need root removal in playground. Local author Jamey Wilkins will speak at October 12 Family Event. **Nominating Committee** – Will need to fill 2 deacon and 2 elder positions for election next year. Stewardship **Task Force** – Will finish bulletin board. free standing visual, and signs above doorway on schedule. Will speak for 5 min at beginning of Sunday, October 3<sup>rd</sup> "kickoff."


