PASTORAL REFLECTIONS

The Christmas Gifts

In the Gospel of Matthew, chapter 2, verse 11, we hear about the very first Christmas gifts: "And going into the house they saw the Child with Mary His mother and they fell down and worshipped Him. Then opening their treasure bags, they presented to him gifts, gold and frankincense and Myrrh." Traditionally, we know the bearers of these gifts as The Three Wise Men or The Three Magi. They are the subject of many stories, songs, carols, and Christmas cards. But who were they? How many were there? The Bible only says they were "wise men from the east." (Matthew 2:1).

So we know they traveled from eastern countries. They are also traditionally believed to be magi, philosophers, or astrologers, but wherever they were from, they knew about the God of Abraham and the promise of a Messiah. They, like other Jewish believers, were hoping this child was the longed for consolation of Israel. Therefore, these wise ones, since they followed the star, studied the heavens but were also familiar with scripture. Mathew, chapter 2, verses 1 and 2 state: "Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? For we have seen his star in the east, and have come to worship him."

We do know that these wise magi brought some precious gifts. Gold was considered a precious metal then, as it is now. Frankincense was used in worship (Exodus. 30:34), and was used to accompany offerings (Lev. 2:1, 16; 6:15; 24:7). Frankincense when lighted had a fragrant smell and became a symbol of prayers rising to heaven (Ps. 141:2; Luke 1:10). Myrrh was one of the ingredients in anointing oil (Exodus 30:23).

In the Old Testament, prophets anointed kings and priests with oil. However, the child these men came to worship was the true anointed one: Christ means the anointed one. In Luke 4:18, Jesus states: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised, To preach the acceptable year of the Lord."

As we complete Christmas gift-buying and wrap presents, let us allow time amidst the busyness and preparation to celebrate the birth of our Savior. Remember that night over 2000 years ago when the wise ones traveled many, many miles following the brightness of a star in order to worship a new born child. Remember the gifts they gave, but more importantly remember the great gift God gave to us: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3: 16)





SUMMARY OF SESSION MEETING

The regular November Stated Session was held in the church library on Wednesday, November 6, 2019. Session members present included: Linda Hamilton, John Roush, Larry Stout, Bill Taylor, Nicole Whetstone, and Rev. Dr. Julie Kling, moderator. Don Steen, Bob Humberger, and Jody Amor were excused.

Pastor Kling reviewed the first three of the seven marks of a vital congregation and discussed the fourth, "Empower Servant Leadership." She then asked several reflection questions concerning leadership such as "Do you think of yourself as a servant of Christ and how does the church identify, equip, and train our leaders?" Pastor Kling concluded the discussion in prayer.

The clerk reported the following Sunday Worship Attendance in October: 6-53; 13-47; 20-46; and 27-41.

Pastor Kling gave a verbal report of her activities in October. She did her normal sermon preparation and preaching on Sundays as well as preparation for Thanksgiving, Hanging of the Green, Advent, and Christmas worship opportunities. She consulted with Bill Taylor on the Stewardship Emphasis. She participated in a Pastors' Maumee Presbytery retreat on leadership and assisted in a funeral for a non-member. She did some visitation. Pastor Julie announced her vacation that included missing Sunday services on Dec. 29 and Jan. 5.

The Treasurer's report is summarized as: October Income - \$8,693; October Expenditures - \$9,195; October Net - -\$502; Year to date income - \$115,822; Year to date expenditures - \$90,335; Year to date net - \$25,487

Administration and Finance – Budget proposals for 2020 requested from Leadership Teams before November 30. Christian Growth and Nurture – Christmas bulletin covers will be provided in December. Consider giving unused books in Church Library to Christian Resources International (CRY). Fellowship and Service – 65 at Thanksgiving luncheon with \$213 donated. Thanks Mike!!!

Music, Worship, and Sacraments – Battery candles sought for Christmas Eve service. Witness and Outreach – Operation Christmas Child underway, used bible collection in January for CRY Mission, special invites will be provided for members to use for Christmas services. Rainbow Station Board – Session will offer \$500 to assist Rainbow Station family obtain housing. Personnel Committee – Still seeking organist. Stewardship Task Force – 28 of 81 pledges returned for \$82,984 to date. Better total pledges at this point than 2018. Presbytery Report – Next meeting November 19.

Pastor Kling closed the meeting with prayer.
