Pastoral Reflection: "Beware and Be Awake"

We have begun our Advent journey and a new liturgical year as we head towards Christmas. So, Happy New Liturgical Year!

During the Thanksgiving holiday break maybe you watched some new movies or old family favorites. Perhaps you took time to watch TV shows, Christmas specials, or Turner Classic Movies. However, at some point did you watch the evening news? Watching the evening news we find ourselves forced to see the violence humans inflict on other humans as we witness war in Israel, Gaza, or the Ukraine. We may ask ourselves: where is God? How do we live in changing times? How do we cope and have hope?

In chapter 13 of the Gospel of Mark, Jesus speaks to his disciples just before he begins his journey to the cross. He mentions the destruction of the temple (Mark 13:1-8), the persecutions to come (Mark 13:9-13), the promise of Jesus' return (Mark 13:24-27), and the parable of the fig tree (Mark 13:28-31). In the very last section of the chapter, Mark 13:33-37 focuses on watching and waiting for Christ's return. It uses many verbs to give us warning and to call us to readiness.

In Mark 13:33, Jesus tells all to "beware". It is connected with the warning to wait for the coming of Christ. A clear message for our Advent journey is to be ready and be watchful. Also in verse 33 we are told to "Be awake". This verb can also be translated as "to be watchful with alertness". Jesus, in the previous verse (Mark 13:32), indicates the time of his return is unknown to the angels and to him (the Son), as only God knows. Our Advent journey is a time to reflect upon how we are watching and waiting. Do we long and hope for Christ's return? How do we watch and wait? This waiting is not to be a passive waiting. The Greek verb used for watch in the text also means "keeping watch over" or "caring for others".

In Mark 13:34, Jesus shares a brief parable of someone leaving

Jesus explains through the parable that all those left behind have an assigned job to do and are empowered to do their jobs while waiting for the head of household to return. Likewise, as disciples, we are empowered to care for God's world and God's children until he returns—no passive waiting here. God *has* guided and provided, God *does* guide and provide, and God *will* guide and provide.
