Pastoral Reflection: Dynamic Disciples

This past week I overhead a conversation about which actor that has played Batman did the best job. The consensus was that Adam West did the best job. The conversation then went on to include Robin, and so the importance of both members of the "dynamic duo" was then discussed. What does the word dynamic mean?

The word dynamic as an adjective means "characterized by constant change, activity, or progress" and "positive in attitude and full of energy and new ideas." Dynamic as a noun means "a force that stimulates change or progress within a system or process." And, as a musical term, the noun dynamics refers to the level of sound, the loudness or softness, for a musical composition.

The word dynamic needs to apply to discipleship. We need to be dynamic disciples. The church as the body of Christ is currently faced with change. Disciples throughout the ages have had to address change and were to be people constantly on the move following Jesus and obeying his command to make disciples of all nations. Note that these dynamic disciples on the move need to have positive attitudes, have energy to share their faith, and be open to new ideas as the Holy Spirit moves in their midst. And to apply the musical definition of dynamics, these disciples are sometimes called to proclaim the word boldly and other times with softness listen to the stories of others as they come to their assistance.

In his book, A Spirituality of Waiting, Henri Nouwen examines all four Gospels and stresses that in each one Jesus is the one in control who is preaching to the crowds and capable of miracles. But then in the middle of the story, the world of the disciples changes as Jesus points toward Jerusalem and announces that he will be handed over to the authorities and will suffer and die. Jesus' ministry takes a different focus as he focuses on his final gift of redemption, compassion, and love.

The disciples followed Jesus in his early earthly ministry and listened to him preach and do miraculous things. But the truly miraculous days were ahead when Jesus allowed himself to be handed over, betrayed, beaten, and unjustly accused. Jesus refused to forgo the cross. Jesus did not kill his enemies but instead forgave them. Jesus allowed God to control his life.

When Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter quickly answers, "You are the Messiah." Peter also scolds and tries to correct Jesus when Jesus says he must suffer. A Messiah who suffers doesn't fit Peter's notion of a Messiah. We might, like Peter, have a hard time with the direction that Jesus' life must take. After all, we

like to be in control; we don't want to be passive and allow things to happen to us. Yet here Jesus glorifies this way. Peter questions how Jesus can even consider such a path of submission. Jesus says "Get behind me" — which is exactly where we need to be as dynamic disciples.

Following Jesus is a choice. It is a voluntary "yes" to Jesus and following him into the world to help build the Kingdom of God. Discipleship is about discipline, hard work, change, obedience, and commitment. It isn't easy, but it is possible. It draws us closer to Christ and makes us more Christlike.

Dynamic means characterized by constant change, activity, or progress. Jesus stimulates change or progress within a system or process. That adjective fits us if we say "yes" to responding to Christ. We are called to be dynamic disciples.
