Pastoral Reflection: A Reminder that “Church” is a Verb

Recently I have found myself engaged in discussions about how to define church. Many persons think of church as a physical building or edifice in which people gather on Sundays and other sacred times. Others argue that church is the people of God. Yet others define church as a collection of traditions and expressions of faith. But what if church is a verb?

If we begin to think of church as a verb, we start to see the church as something we do, actively engaging in mission, ministry, and prayer rather than limiting our definition to a particular place or a particular group. We are “doing” church when we join together sharing love for one another and for God. That’s what happened on the day of Pentecost in the book of Acts when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples, empowering them to go out and share the good news of Jesus with others. They gathered together in one place, but they became the church. The Spirit of God must have been evident in their lives as others were drawn to join them.

What then does it mean to be the church today? It means being an active community of believers who come together to worship God, support one another, and reach out in mission. It also means being persons who are open to the wisdom of the Spirit to make a difference in the world. The day of Pentecost marks the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles, who were then called to spread the Good News throughout the world.

As a child, I was taught that Pentecost is the birthday of the church, but isn’t it really the birth of an active mission for the church? The mission of the church is to preach the gospel by word and action to all nations. While a daunting and overwhelming task, it is possible through the Spirit acting within us to overcome obstacles, break down barriers, and communicate the Gospel in a way that is relevant and meaningful to all we encounter.

According to Catherine of Sienna, “Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire.” Isn’t that the mission of the church? Each of us has been created by God and given a specific purpose and a mission. When we say “yes” to that mission we become agents of change and transformation in the world. Therefore, seeing church as an active rather than a passive verb means acting as light in a dark world and loving and caring for those in need. As we embrace this mission, we become part of an active church of people bringing healing and hope to a broken world.

Book: *Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory* by Tod Bolsinger

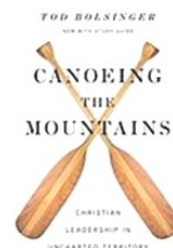
Date: Sunday, June 25: Chapters 8 and 9 “Don’t Just Stand There...Do Something”
