Pastoral Reflection: Summer Priorities

As summer begins, many are busy prioritizing summer plans, trying to decide what remodeling projects or cleaning projects may get done on the house, or what trips to visit family or friends can be afforded. It might be time to clean out the attic or the closet or complete other tasks that remain unfinished. So, as summer lists are made and calendars set, is time allowed for developing one's relationship to Jesus and strengthening one's discipleship?

We are all called to develop our discipleship, which means allowing time to become a disciple who is active in the world and willing to follow as Jesus calls. Becoming a stronger disciple for Jesus means transformation, movement, and change. Take time this summer as you make your lists to read the Gospel of Mark. It is a Gospel about Jesus' dynamic and life-changing ministry and mission.

Mark 8:27-38 is one of the passages that sums up what Jesus' ministry is about and how his disciples are to join him by following him:

27 And Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi. And on the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" 28 And they told him, "John the Baptist; and others say, Elijah; and others, one of the prophets." 29 And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Christ." 30 And he strictly charged them to tell no one about him. 31 And he began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes and be killed, and after three days rise again. 32 And he said this plainly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. 33 But turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and

said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man." 34 And calling the crowd to him with his disciples, he said to them, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and foll ow me. 35 For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. 36 For what does it profit a man to gain the whole worl d and forfeit his soul? 37 For what can a man give in return for his soul? 38 For whoever is ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of Man also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy ang els."

W.H. Vanstone, in his book called *The Stature of Waiting*, calls readers' attention to the peculiar plot of the Gospels. In the beginning chapters of each Gospel, Jesus is in charge. He is the central figure speaking to crowds and bringing healing and miracles into people's lives. Later, in most of the Gospel narratives, Jesus travels far to the north and focuses on Jerusalem and his future, trying to explain that he will be "handed over" to suffer and die. At this point in the Gospels, Jesus has one miracle left to do, as he knows his journey leads to the cross and his resurrection because of God's compassion and love for us. Jesus submits himself to God's will.

We may pick up a book to read this summer and will expect its plot to focus on the main characters having control and independence over their lives, as we usually frown upon submission and dependence. Jesus' earthly ministry was always awesome, but the real glory and power came when he allowed himself to be betrayed, beaten, and in pain on his journey to the cross. Note that even on the cross Jesus did not kill or injure his enemies, but forgave them. Jesus allowed God to control his life to the end.

B. D. Strayhorn writes: "To experience life in Christ requires feeling the weight of his cross in our daily discipleship. It's not easy, but it's not impossible. When we say yes to the cross, we don't have to bear the load alone. The burden of the cross is no burden at all—not when we're yoked with Christ. Deny yourself by giving yourself for others in Christ's name. Take up your cross and follow him."




