PASTORAL REFLECTIONS

We are the Church!

While officially Lent ends April 5 as Holy Week begins, as we walk through this new and strange territory of coping with CoVid19, I feel like Lent has been extended for an indefinite period. I have spent many hours in Zoom calls and Facebook groups with other Presbyterian pastors, elders, and colleagues from other denominations as we all struggle to determine how congregations can still hold services and communicate with one another using technology. This is a new road; something they did not prepare us for in seminary.

I used to grumble and complain anytime my college teaching responsibilities required me to participate in a Zoom call or webinar. Now, I look forward to Zoom meetings as it is a way to connect with others during this time of social distancing and sheltering in place. In the weekly Maumee Valley Presbytery Zoom calls for pastors and clerks, we share ideas and problems trying to figure out how to be the church. With many out of work, the lack of medical supplies, loved ones ill, first responders and medical workers risking their lives, and businesses facing an unknown future, this is a time, more than ever, when the church needs to be the church. While church buildings may be closed, there is still church! The church is the people of God! We are the church!

Remember the Vacation Bible School Song: "We are the Church"? "I am the church! You are the church! We are the church together! All who follow Jesus, all around the world! Yes, we're the church together!" Those words, the words of the chorus are probably familiar. But do you know the verses?

The first verse affirms "The church is not a building; the church is not a steeple; the church is not a resting place; the church is a people." The second verse states that the church is a diverse community of believers "with many kinds of people" while the third verse ends with the statement that the church is "always learning". (Which we are definitely doing now!) The

Good Friday Community Prayer Walk

(Pray by Car, Walking alone, or at Home)
Observe Safe Sheltering in Place and Pray from Home!
April 10, 2020

Good Friday is traditionally a time of prayer and reflection. However, especially during this time of COVID19, community members of all faiths and beliefs are invited to spend some time in prayer and reflection for our community and world. Since this is a time of "sheltering in place" and it is not safe or ethical to gather in groups, we can still come together in prayer. You are invited to spend some time on Good Friday either by walking individually or driving by in your car at a site near you representative of the various places and businesses in this prayer guide. Do not enter the building, just pause or park safely and spend a few moments in prayer. Or, join in this prayer walk from home or wherever you are.

Feel free to add other facilities, places, and persons to the prayer list. The important thing is to uplift those in our community and world in prayer for healing, safety, and hope.

Begin with prayer or silent reflection;

Read scripture or other appropriate reading: Psalm 23 or Psalm 91 Uplift in thoughts and prayers the following persons and concerns:

Community Schools and Universities:

Pray for Administrators, Teachers, Support Staff, and Students

Government and Community Safety:

Elected and appointed officials; Government office workers; Police officers; Fire-fighters; Ambulance drivers; Paramedics and EMTs; Postal workers; Prison and security workers

Health care:

Physicians; Dentists; Nurses and nursing assistants; Therapists and technicians; Administrators; Support staff; Home Health Care providers

Social Work, Childcare, and Community Organizations:

Child care directors, teachers, and staff; Social workers; Counselors and therapists; Directors of non-profit organizations; Staff and volunteers of non-profits

Businesses and Industries:

Store managers and all workers; Food service workers; Business owners; Industrial managers and workers; Transportation workers; Office workers; Factory workers

Religious and Faith-based Institutions:

Religious leaders - local, national, and global; Religious community members; Chaplains and pastoral care workers; Religious institution support staff; Religious sponsored institutions and organizations

A letter received from the Kirkmont Center: Is Kirkmont Center still open?

This letter is painful to write. For the foreseeable future Kirkmont cannot support itself. For ten years we have communicated about safety and health challenges with buildings and infrastructure. Thanks to you, we have addressed them. We continue to be forthright in communicating.

Our facilities are closed. Retreat groups and schools have cancelled through May. We have no user revenue. With no user revenue, neither staff nor nondiscretionary bills can be paid. We are in communication with other camps who have laid off staff and cut management hours. We are exploring every option for 2020 summer camps and beyond.

Kirkmont is a nonprofit with a mission of serving the church and, more broadly, all people in all seasons. Like many, we want to get back to fulfilling our mission.

SUMMARY OF SESSION MEETING

The regular March Stated Session was held in the church library on Wednesday, March 4, 2020. Session members present included: Jody Amor, Linda Hamilton, John Roush, Larry Stout, Bill Taylor, Nicole Whetstone, and Rev. Dr. Julie Kling, moderator. Don Steen and Bob Humberger were excused

Pastor Kling led a discussion of "Revitalization." She proposed several definitions and three quotes, one by Calvin. She invited the elders' reflections on these definitions. She than gave the example of the story of Mary and Martha. Pastor Cling challenged the elders to be like Mary and listen to the Lord and then go out into the world and serve. Pastor Kling closed the discussion with prayer.

The Clerk Bill Taylor distributed drafts of the church annual report for review and announced the February Sunday Worship Attendance: February 2nd - 36; 9th - 34; 16th - 43; and 23rd - 40.

Pastor Kling reported these activities in February: "During February, I preached Sunday sermons and prepared worship service bulletins for February Sundays and officiated at Communion Services. I also provided pastoral support for concerned persons by phone and in person. In mid-February, I attended a biblical preaching workshop on Lenten scriptures. I continued to prepare services for February, Ash Wednesday, and Lent and also to prepare for the Holy Week mini-retreat and Holy Week Services. I officiated at the Ash Wednesday Service which was a joint service with the First and Eastside Presbyterian Churches. I also moderated the February session meeting and made a pastoral visit to a nursing home, follow-up phone calls, and touched base with some of the Committee leadership chairs. I also have been discussing with committee members and other members about the Mobile Health Fair regarding sponsoring with area agencies a health fair for our area/county. I am in the process of contacting other agencies. I also followed up by phone with a party who had expressed interest in the Organist Position. Two members of the Personnel Committee have been involved in contacting the person as well. I attended Presbytery in Defiance and a webinar on "Transforming Life Skills to Ministry Skills." In addition, I attended the first Sunday luncheon and stayed to play games and chat. I have also been conducting a new membership class during the Coffee with Calvin time. Also, if you have any topics of interest for the Coffee with Calvin times on Sundays, please feel free to contact me."

The Treasurer's report for February: February 2020 income - \$10,818; February 2020 expenditures - \$11,776; February 2020 surplus or (deficit) - (\$959); 2019/2020 Year to date income - \$20,589; 2019/2020 Year to date expenditures - \$20,768 and 2019/2020 Year to date surplus or (deficit) - \$179 (Report includes Rainbow Station).

The Leadership team reports included: Christian Growth and Nurture – Book Buggy is active again, Teachers' Appreciation Sunday will be on May 3rd, VBS will be July 20 – 24 with theme "Olympics/ Running for the Prize;" Fellowship and Service – Grad Party for Nathan Cowdrey will be Friday, May 15 and church clean-up day will be Saturday, May 16; Witness and Outreach – Will host fellowship lunch on Sunday, April 5 and invites will be distributed for Holy Week events
Rainbow station – Currently 17 preschoolers and 3 toddlers are enrolled; Nominating Committee – In need of 2 elder nominees; and Presbytery Report – Bill Taylor will represent FPC at the next presbytery meeting in Norwalk on May19th.

Under old business the Session dismissed by consensus a tabled MOTION to modify the serving of communion.

Under new business the Session approved by consensus for Nicole Whetstone and Bill Taylor to meet with new church member during Sunday School Hour on Sunday, March 29th.

Pastor Kling closed the meeting with prayer.
