PASTORAL REFLECTIONS

Alleluia! Christ Has Risen!

Our response to this greeting should be: "He is risen indeed!" Easter is a reminder that God is in control. That even when we look around us and see suffering and death, life is here! Even when we listen and hear words of hate, love is calling! Easter is a reminder to believe and have hope. For God is the victor and has given the gift of the resurrection. This is the miracle of Easter.

We can stand before the Risen Christ and know that when we are filled with despair, Christ will raise us up with hope. When we are buried in the tomb of our sin and selfishness, Christ will fill us with mercy and grace. SUMMARY OF SESSION MEETING

The regular February Stated Session was held via Zoom on Wednesday, February 10, 2021. Session members present included: Jody Amor, Linda Hamilton, John Roush, Larry Stout, Bill Taylor, and Rev. Dr. Julie Kling, moderator. Bob Humberger and Ken Myers were absent. Pastor Kling opened with a poetic prayer provided by Christopher Fry and discussed discipleship, evangelism, and our living our faith.

With the State's ruling Sandusky County's COVID-19 status as "red", weekly Sunday School and Palm Sunday and Ash Wednesday services will be on Zoom. Adult Sunday School will begin study of the Old Testament book of Ruth. Fremont Clergy Fellowship is preparing a composite video Good Friday Service.

Pastor Kling gave a verbal report of her January activities to Session.

The treasurers' report for January (includes Rainbow Station): income - \$10,512, expenditures - \$10,913, deficit - \$401.

The Leadership Team reports included: **Fellowship and Service** – Team is planning welcome backto-church reception when normal church services resume. **Presbytery Report** – Pastor Kling and Bill Taylor will be attending the quarterly ZOOM Presbytery meeting on February 16. **Witness and Outreach -** John Roush will represent FPC at the up-coming two Discipleship Zoom Meetings

There was no old, but new business included approval to make the annual \$1,000 Mission pledge to Maumee Valley Presbytery again in 2021. Further Session approved a tentative Church Budget for the fiscal year 2021 to receive final approval at the May Session meeting. The church will receive "One Great Hour of Sharing" special offering during Holy Week. Finally, Session approved the appointment of Lawrence Van Dyne and Russell Abbott to new 9-year terms as members of the Foundation Board. (This appointment must be affirmed by the congregation at the Annual Congregational Meeting.)

Pastor Kling closed the meeting with prayer.
