PASTORAL REFLECTIONS

Epiphany, Time for Determination and Persistence

Two years ago, I shared that the season of Epiphany reminded us to be determined and persistent. At the time, I shared my experiences of frustration trying to find a specific chain restaurant in the Pittsburgh area. It took me five tries to find one franchise that was still open. Looking back, my search for a specific restaurant seems unimportant and very trivial in light of the concerns and issues we have all faced during 2020.

We come to the world with our own expectations and demand that they be met. We desire control. This past year has been a year of learning that we cannot always control what goes on around us. There are also times when we need to sacrifice our own wants and desires for the safety and well-being of others. Christmas is a time of giving and awareness of others; usually at Christmas people are more generous and hospitable than they are at other times of the year. However, I am amazed at the number of times I have heard people say they are ignoring the call for reduced gatherings and will "party hardy" on New Year's Eve. They are determined to do what they want regardless of potential consequences for themselves or others.

Determination and persistence can be a good thing, but what is the goal? What drives that determination? Selfish concerns or a genuine concern for others? The Scripture for Epiphany is Matthew 2:1-12 which tells of the Three Magi and their determination to find the Christ child. The Magi were asking around trying to find out where the holy child was to be born. When Herod heard this, he was not a happy camper. He asked the Magi to come to see him and tell him what this following the star business is about. Herod's determination to find out what was going on was based on self-preservation and self-concern. If this child was the Promised One of which the prophets had spoken, Herod wanted to have him killed because he was afraid of losing his power.

On the other hand, the Magi were determined to find the child because they wanted the words of the prophets to come to fruition. They knew this child came for all people, and the world needed this child. They were willing to risk Herod's anger in order to find the Christ Child and worship him.

Friends who have recently made the decision to move from independent living to a supported living environment have done so, not because they want to, but out of concern for their family and friends and concern for each other. This is a time of transition for them. They shared this prayer by Walter Brueggemann from his book *Awed to Heaven: Rooted in Earth.* This prayer, while an Advent prayer, is appropriate for facing a new year as it deals with changing times and awaiting Christ's presence in our lives. Part of the prayer appears below:

In our secret yearnings we wait for your coming,

SUMMARY OF SESSION MEETING

The regular December Stated Session was held via Zoom on Wednesday, December 9, 2020. Session members present included: Jody Amor, Bob Humberger, Ken Myers, John Roush, Larry Stout, Bill Taylor, and Rev. Dr. Julie Kling, moderator. Linda Hamilton was absent.

Pastor Kling opened the meeting with prayer.

Pastor's Report:

During November, I preached Sunday sermons and prepared worship services for Zoom. I also assisted with the technological leadership for the Adult Sunday School via Zoom. I provided pastoral counseling for concerned persons by phone. I also did some reading and study of COVID19 and participated in several related zoom calls. I moderated the November session meeting and participated in some of the weekly Maumee Valley Presbytery Zoom calls for Pastors and church leaders. I met with some of the members of a committee working with leadership for return to inperson worship, as we moved to Zoom-only services as Sandusky County became red on the COVID19 scale. I am participating in a weekly Bible study and I attended some of the lectionary study for pastors and other church leaders. In addition, I worked with church members to provide bagged snacks for the Terra students who live at The Landings. Snacks were available for students before they left for Thanksgiving break and moved to online learning. Snacks were also offered during finals week for the few who remained on campus. I have also joined the book study that Matt Meinke is leading on racial justice and have started to prepare Advent and Christmas Services for Sundays as well as Advent Wednesday night Zoom prayer services. Sunday schedule currently begins with Adult Sunday School at 9 am and Zoom worship at 10 am, both via Zoom, and Wednesday night Advent services at 6:00 p.m. via Zoom.

Guest Joan Gamble reported that Rainbow Station was doing fine with 9 children enrolled. She also reported Habitat of Humanity donated item(s) for the playground.

The clerk, Bill Taylor, reported that Mary Gocke had moved to her husband's church, Sacred Heart.

The treasurers' report for November (includes Rainbow Station) was: income - \$6,733, expenditures - \$12,399, surplus or (deficit) – (\$5,666), 2020 year to date income - \$104,932, expenditures - \$108,179, and surplus or (deficit) – (\$3,284).

The Leadership Team reports included: Administration and Finance – The inoperable emergency lighting fixtures in 1st. floor hallway have been replaced by Burkett Industries; Stewardship Task Force – Follow-up calls have been made and 2021 pledge total is comparable to the 2020 total (PTL!); Personnel Committee – Meeting is planned prior to end of year; and Presbytery Report – Pastor Kling and Bill Taylor attended the quarterly ZOOM Presbytery meeting on November 17. Rev. Dave Mathews, the one-time chaplain at Toledo University, was installed as the new Presbytery moderator. He has filled our pulpit in the past.

New Business included: The pastor will send every member a letter announcing the Christmas Eve Zoom worship service at 7:30 p.m. along with Zoom instructions and envelopes for contributing to Liberty Center homeless shelter and the annual special PCUSA Joy offering. Amy and Scott will have a 3% pay raise.

Pastor Kling closed the meeting with an Advent prayer from the week three service.


