#### **Building Congregational Vitality as a "Matthew 25 Church"**

At their June meeting, our session approved our church's becoming a "Matthew 25 Church" with emphasis on "Church Revitalization." The commitment was based upon Jesus' teaching in Matthew 25:31–46.

You might think that the vitality of a congregation or worshiping community is based on the number of members, the scope of programs, the size of financial gifts or some other statistics. Not so — at least not entirely. Rather, a community's vitality is primarily its spiritual strength and its capacity for purposeful mission.

The Presbyterian Mission Agency of the PC(USA) has made a profound commitment to help FPC turn things around. This Agency proposes that there are seven marks to help you determine your current level of vitality — and then various processes for self-assessment, discernment and renewed commitment to the habits that foster an energetic engagement with the Spirit's work in the world.

#### Here are the seven marks:

- 1. A commitment to forming disciples over every member's lifetime.
- 2. Embracing the call to evangelism.
- 3. An outward focus.
- 4. Empowering every member to discover their individual calling and the gifts God has given them so they can go forth and serve.
- 5. Spirit-inspired worship that challenges, teaches, transforms, convicts and energizes us so when we are sent out, we have experienced the wonder of God and are changed for the better from when we arrived.
- 6. Caring relationships modeled on God's love.
- 7. Congregations with healthy systems.

Worshiping communities experiencing congregational vitality will find themselves following Jesus into personal and congregational patterns and practices of prayer and worship, learning and reflection. They will demonstrate to the world God's promises and life-giving power in this age and the world to come.

More will be shared in future newsletters and during Sunday worship about what it means to be a Matthew 25 Church and exploring our call to mission in our community and world. If you have any questions, please contact Pastor Julie.

# **SUMMARY OF SESSION MEETING**

FPC Session held its regular monthly meeting on June 5, 2019, at 7:15 p.m. in the church Library. Session members present were: Moderator Rev. Dr. Julie Kling, Jody Amor, Linda Hamilton, John Roush, Larry Stout, Bill Taylor and Nicole Whetstone.

Don Steen and Bob Humberger were excused.

Pastor Kling opened the meeting with prayer. She read Matthew 25:14-30 and reviewed Presbytery's invitation to FPC to be a "Mathew 25 Church" with three focus areas of congregational vitality, structural racism and systematic poverty. The members of Session agreed to pursue the congregational vitality focus first as a foundation for pursuing the remaining areas.

**Upcoming Dates and Events:** 

June 8: Spiritual Leadership Training in Norwalk with Joan Gray.

June 9: Pentecost

June 16: Moving downstairs for service.

June 17-21: Vacation Bible School.

June 24: Migrant Health Fair at the Old Fort Grade School. Volunteers are needed.

There was a single motion passed at the meeting by John Roush and seconded by Bill Taylor to declare FPC a "Matthew 25 Church" and pursue the congregational vitality focus.

On June 8 Linda Hamilton, Bill Taylor, and John Roush will be attending the Presbytery seminar on Spiritual Leadership led by Rev. Dr. Joan Gray at the Norwalk church. Engagement with East Side Church was discussed. Pastor Kling will explore this with the East Side Session.

Session Clerk, Bill Taylor reported the May Sunday Worship Attendance: May 5 - 59, May 12 - 51, May 19 - 50, and May 26 - 38.

Pastor Kling reported that during May, she preached Sunday sermons and prepared worship service bulletins for the Sundays of May. She moderated Session, met with Vida Church pastor to prepare service for May 5, delivered

semester survival packages to Terra students, and talked with students inviting them to the May 5 Taco Lunch. During May, she attended the Rummage Sale and talked with some community members, conducted a funeral service, two committal services, and attended the Rachel's Circle. May also involved officiating at Communion Services and some pastoral counseling and visitation. She took communion to shut ins. She provided pastoral counseling and support for concerned in person. Issues for people in the area continue to be issues of finding affordable housing and paying utilities. She met with members of one of the committees to discuss possible activities and community outreach. She served as registrar for and attended a retreat for church leaders in Ohio and Pennsylvania and met with a bride to begin to plan her 2020 wedding. She wrote an article for the May and June newsletter. She was engaged in some ministry for the Presbytery BCL committee and participated in a prayer group that focused on the foundations of prayer for ministry.

The Treasurer's Report showed as of May 31 year-to-date expenses were \$50,831 and income was \$66,029 for a \$21,847 surplus. A detailed report is posted on bulletin board.

The reports from the leadership teams follow:

Witness and Outreach – Josh Ross will be coordinating the 2019 Operation Christmas
Child. He is planning a Christmas in July event to seek early funding and congregation awareness. WOLT is planning a chicken BBQ on August 10 to benefit Presbyterian Disaster Assistance in Ohio.
WOLT is planning a BBQ lunch and Bingo in July for Terra Dorm residents.

Personnel – Jody Amor is the new Session liaison to the Personnel Committee. The committee has prepared a draft position description for an organist.

Presbytery - Bill Taylor provided three Presbytery Reports: 1. Statistical, 2. Church Pledges, 3. Restructure Design Committee. These are posted on the bulletin board.

Pastor Kling closed the meeting with prayer.
