#### **PASTORAL REFLECTIONS**

#### "You Are Not Alone on an Island"

One of my favorite TV shows as a child was Gilligan's Island. Are you humming the opening theme now? (Side comment: you can sing Amazing Grace to the tune of Gilligan's Island theme song. I learned this at summer youth camp!) If you are not familiar with Gilligan's Island, it is the story of Gilligan, his boss the skipper, and the passengers on a sight-seeing boat being shipwrecked on a tropical island. The sitcom focuses on their struggles to try to get off the island. While they are on that island for the duration of the sitcom, they are more successful at possibly getting off the island when they work together.

John Donne, an English poet of the late sixteenth and early seventeenth century, also wrote about islands and penned:

"No man is an Iland, intire of itselfe; every man is a peece of the Continent, a part of the maine;

....any mans death diminishes me, because I am involved in Mankinde;"

(Olde English Version)

These verses are part of a larger work titled *Meditation 17* that was written when Donne was seriously ill in 1623 as part of a collection titled *Devotions Upon Emergent Occasions*. Donne points out that we are all connected and that anyone's death or suffering should affect all of us. Through God and through being a human being, we suffer when others suffer. Not only is all humankind connected, none of us can be or are self-sufficient. We rely on each other. Donne was also an Anglican priest and may have used *Meditation 17* as part of a sermon. In addition to the image of the island, Donne also uses the image of a bell to communicate the reality of death for all humanity. When one person dies, all humanity should mourn.

The opening line of *Meditation 17* was also incorporated into a folk song written by Peter Schieckele and sung by Joan Baez as well as others:

"No man is an island, No man stands alone, Each man's joy is joy to me, Each man's grief is my own. We need one another, So I will defend, Each man as my brother, Each man as my friend."

This idea of connectedness was also stressed by the 20<sup>th</sup> century German theologian Karl Rahner who believed that God always desired to reach out beyond God's self.

God created all the world, and Rahner stressed that God desires to be in relationship with "the Other," this entire created world. Out of this love and desire, God eventually sent Jesus.

Rebecca Gresham-Kesner writes in her article "Connecting During the Coronavirus" that as Presbyterians we identify ourselves as the "connectional church" and "have a profound theological understanding that we are better together. In fact, we are called to be together." Gresham-Kesner provides examples of her own experience of working ecumenically before and during the pandemic that enriched everyone. But she observes that we often overlook the opportunities of working with others because we are "programmed to do our own thing." So individual churches can become islands to themselves and only concerned about their own needs. Gresham-Kesner proposes several questions for churches to consider. The last of the questions states: "Could we perhaps set our differences down to serve the greater need?"

During this time of COVID19, this is a question we all need to ask ourselves. How can we work together to serve the greater need? While this is a period of profound stress and anxiety for everyone, we still need to pause and consider: How do my own words and actions during this time affect others? I am not alone on my island. I do need to consider the health and well-being of others. Perhaps Donne had read Romans 14:7: "For none of us lives for ourselves alone, and none of us dies for ourselves alone."

SUMMARY OF SESSION MEETING

The regular May Stated Session was held virtually via Zoom on Wednesday, May 7, 2020. Session members present included: Jody Amor, Bob Humberger, John Roush, Larry Stout, Bill Taylor, Nicole Whetstone, and Rev. Dr. Julie Kling, moderator. Don Steen and Linda Hamilton were excused.

Pastor Kling opened the meeting with prayer.

The Clerk Bill Taylor announced the April Sunday Zoom Worship Attendance: April 5-50, 12-65, 19-35, and 26-35.

The Treasurer's report was provided later: April 2020 income - \$10,818; April 2020 expenditures - \$14,088; April 2020 (deficit) - (\$3,877); 2020 Year to date income - \$34,869; 2020 Year to date expenditures - \$44,443 and 2020 Year to date (deficit) - (\$9,754) (Report includes Rainbow Station).

The session decided to continue closure of the church building to all operations through May 31, 2020 unless otherwise notified; to continue wages and benefits for First Presbyterian Church employees through the May 28 pay date; and endorsed the Rainbow Station board's decision to pay the director full pay and the staff full pay for hours worked and the balance of their regular hours at half pay through May 31 (Rainbow Station personnel wages will be paid from the Scholarship fund.

The session appointed Jody Amor and Bob Humberger as a committee of two to develop a comprehensive plan to return First Presbyterian Church congregation and the building to Ohio state Health Department Covid 19 compliant operation.

Pastor Kling closed the meeting with prayer.
